

Police get helping hand from Rossett farmer with flooding rescue

A FARMER has been praised for his efforts after helping of local police rescue people and their pets in Rossett.

The flooding caused in the wake of Storm Christoph saw many across the North Wales area in a difficult situation. Rural areas were hit hard as photos show this rescue operation at a farm in Wrexham that was surrounded by water.

Officers have today praised the efforts of a local farmer for his assistance.

A spokesman for the Roads Policing Unit of North Wales Police said: “With the help of a local farmer and his trailer, we managed to get through flooded fields to help rescue three people and six dogs in Almere Ferry, Trevalyn yesterday.

“Massive thanks to the farmer and a shout out to our NPAS North East colleagues for their assistance. Great teamwork.

“We'd like to wish all the residents a safe and speedy clean-up operation. A number of roads across the area remain precarious this morning [Friday] so please stay home unless your journey is absolutely essential.”

NPAS North East Waes posted more images on their social media of the operation, adding: “Great multi-agency response around Wrexham today [Thursday] following Storm Christoph especially from North Wales Police officers and this local farmer helping residents to safety.”
